
Christmas is over and Spring is yet to The holiday lights have been packed up and put away. In the greenhouse the seeds for this summer's flowers are just starting to go in. what's happening at Shore Acres?

Well, no matter what's going on in the garden, there's a heck of a big something that's always going on just a few steps outside the garden walls, namely, the Pacific Ocean. While Pacific means "peaceful" the last series of winter storms has made the coastal waters anything but - and given visitors lots of opportunities for "primo" wave watching.

Working in the garden we tend to forget what is "hiding" beyond the cypress and spruce windbreaks. But the beauty of cliffs, beaches, reefs and islands and the ever changing ocean are eternally there. The natural power, beauty, sometimes even savagery of the ocean, typified by the famous "Shore Acres Wave", are a fitting complement to the manmade symmetry and order of the garden.

Ultimately it is this interplay of opposites that makes up the beautiful whole that is Shore Acres. Louis Simpson recognized this fact way back when and this truth is constantly waiting to be rediscovered by the visitor.

The garden may be taking a brief "rest" (though you might be surprised at what's blooming even now). Please take a chance to come out and watch wind and waves create their own special splendor.

PARK NOTES

After the Friends' holiday lights have been removed, and before the real crunch of reservation information starts, the most frequently asked telephone question is, "How big are the waves at Shore Acres today?"

Over the past couple of weeks they've hit hard enough to rattle the windows in the Garden House (and my residence as well).

My favorite description of the marine beauties of Shore Acres was written by Samuel H. Boardman, Oregon's first State Park Superintendent:

"The shoreline is distinctive in character. A sandstone bluff some forty to fifty feet in height challenges the sea in its onward rush. Through incessant attacks, the sea has undermined large slabs of sand-stone. tilting them seaward at a reclining angle of forty-five degrees. In this formation is the setting for one of the most spectacular wave-breaking actions found on our coastline. The waves break against the reclining slab, spray high into the air, then cascade down into the hollow, its final fury spent against the mother bluff. With a turbulent sea, a norther, wind flaking the comber tops, Father Neptune puts on a breath-taking show. Spray fifty feet in the air accompanied by the roar of the breakers will long linger in your memory. seascape photographers, Rembrandt of the sea awaits the click of vour camera."

It's interesting to imagine how Mr. Boardman would have described the garden's 1975 renovation, the holiday lights and the Friends of Shore Acres. I am certain he would have approved, however, as each has made this crown jewel of Oregon's coastal park gems that much more precious.


