How Friends of Shore Acres Happened

n 1986, the Communication Arts Group at Southwestern Oregon Community College decided to tell the story of Shoreacres and Shore Acres State Park by creating a multi-image slide show to be shown at the 5th annual Multi-Image Festival in September. After the Festival, Shirley Bridgham asked Andy LaTomme, manager at Shore Acres State Park, if the park wanted a copy. He said yes. Not long after, Andy asked Shirley and her husband David if they would like to help start a Friends group – a non-profit corporation in association with state parks. They said yes.

An organizational meeting was held on December 4, 1986 at 7:30 pm in Room 12 of Sumner Hall on the campus of Southwestern Oregon Community College. In attendance were Andy LaTomme, John Bergen, Mike Bodkin, David and Shirley Bridgham, John Garner, Marty Giles, George Guthrie, Dick Hansen, Ron Hjort, Tony Mason, and Karen Wuethrich. On that important night, Friends of Shore Acres, Inc. in cooperation with Shore Acres State Park began a long journey of success.


The Shore Acres Story was shown in slide format to thousands of visitors for years, then transferred to VHS tape for easier showing. In 2006, it was transferred to DVD. In 2013, it was transformed again, this time with additional photos courtesy of Caitlin Day, James McDermott, Sunset Bay State Park and the Coos Historical and Maritime Museum. Special thanks goes to Phillip Bridgham for rescuing the original sound track.

The program is about Asa Meade Simpson and his son Louis Jerome and the history of the magnificent estate that Louis called Shoreacres. It continues with what Shore Acres State Park was like in 1986 when the slide show was created. ■



What a great reminder of why we do what we do. Our hope is that in the future, others will experience and enjoy the same opportunities.

Note from David Bridgham - September 2014

The following pages (and Albums) are a chronology of the efforts of Friends of Shore Acres, Inc., but even more than that, tell the tale of the enormous support that the Friends have enjoyed from our regional communities.

This was a movement whose time had come. The Oregon State Legislature had passed "Enabling" Legislation allowing non-profit 501(c)3'organizations to adopt a specific State Park to provide educational and interpretive services to its visitors. Well that's the dry legislative speak for find a core user group that loves that park and let it nurture and care for it.



Shore Acres State Park, 13 miles from town, is the touchstone that we all bring our friends and visitors to when we want to show off the beauty of the Oregon south coast. There was a built-in and pent-up desire to shower this special place with community pride and needed TLC. Outreach to our communities started with the planning sessions with FOSA Board members and volunteers. Dreaming of what could be, planning on now and the future.

Holiday Lights at Shore Acres is a night time interpretation of the formal English style gardens and the reflecting pond at the oriental garden. Historically, the original Simpson mansion built on the bluff at the stone wall, was a Christmas present to Louie Simpson's wife Cassie. From the very first lighting event we recognized the importance to the communities to open the Garden House for our visitors and start building traditions. After 27 annual lightings it thrills me to hear from adults with their young family when they tell us they came to see the lights as kids and now they're bringing their families to grow the tradition.

An important cornerstone to the Holiday Lights tradition is the consistency of our focus on major themes. We have stayed true to who we are and where we're at, interpreting the gardens with flower-lights, sculptures that are inspired by what's found in the gardens as well as many marine related sculptures. The Garden House is beautifully decorated with an old time (Simpson era) theme that fits this historic gardener's cottage.

There are those certainties in life - like the tide at our ocean's shore, the Bay and its tributaries - migrating geese, and the Holiday Lights at Shore Acres. When I see or hear a migrating flock of Canadian Geese I get an itch I can only scratch by stringing lights at Shore Acres.

You will see as you turn these pages that the secret sauce has always been to engage our community, give credit and ownership where deserved, and always try to improve this place that we all love. ■

FRIENDS OF SHORE ACRES ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING MINUTES

A meeting was held on December 4, 1986 at 7:30 pm in room 12 of Sumner Hall on the campus of Southwestern Oregon Community College. In attendance were Andy LaTomme, John Bergen, George Guthrie, Karen Wuethrich, Marty Giles, Ron Hjort, Mike Bodkin, John Garner, Shirley Bridgham, David Bridgham, Dick Hansen and Tony Mason. Andy LaTomme opened the meeting by giving background information about the establishment of non-profit corporations in association with state parks.

Mike Bodkin reviewed the legal steps necessary to establish a corporation and to certify it as tax-exempt under federal and state laws: fees to be paid, legal liability of corporation members and the formation of an initial board of directors.

Discussion followed on the details of the above presentations. The group agreed that a preliminary date of June, 1987 was a goal for establishing the tax-exempt status of the organization and that the group should forego any solicitation of funds until this status has been obtained.

Those present introduced themselves to the group and completed a sign-up sheet with their names and addresses. Each person was asked if he or she desired to serve on the initial board of directors. All except Andy LaTomme, Ron Hjort, Karen Wuethrich and Mike Bodkin responded "yes."

Some discussion followed about the number of state park employees to be allowed to serve on the board at any one time. It was generally agreed that no more than 1/4 of the board should be composed of state park employes, however formal action on this was deferred until bylaws are adopted. It was agreed that the Sunset Bay State Park district manager would serve as a non-voting member of the board. There was some discussion about this and it was understood and agreed that the group would not undertake any projects without the approval of the district park manager or his designee.

Nominations were opened for chairman. Dick Hansen and John Bergen were nominated and declined. John Garner was nominated and unanimously elected. He conducted the balance of the meeting.

A motion to name the organization the "Friends of Shore Acres, Inc," was proposed, seconded and passed.

Mike Bodkin was named to act as legal agent for the Friends of Shore Acres (hereafter referred to as the "Friends") and was thanked for his work thus far. Discussion followed regarding the purposes of the Friends as required for the incorporation papers.

Mike Bodkin stated that he would use wording from a similar organization's application and that he expected the incorporation papers would be returned by the next meeting.

It was decided the scope of the organization would be discussed when bylaws were presented for adoption at a later meeting.

There was discussion about membership in general, voting vs. non-voting membership and graduated membership fees. Action on this was deferred until a later meeting.

A collection was taken to cover the cost of the incorporation fee. A total of \$13.00 was collected from the group.

It was proposed and approved that Mike Bodkin act as initial incorporator for the Friends.

Additional discussion about the purpose of the Friends took place. It was felt that the purposes stated in the articles of incorporation should be broad enough to allow the group to participate in a broad range of activities, including physical development in the park.

The agenda for the next meeting was discussed. It was decided that bylaws and the setting of goals for the group would take up most of the meeting. The board was asked to be prepared to discuss possible goals and committee assignments for that meeting. Dick Hansen was selected to lead the discussion on bylaws.

Andy LaTomme was asked to bring a copy of his park's master plan to assist in coordinating the goals of the Friends with those of State Parks. He was also asked to prepare a draft set of bylaws, based on those used by existing cooperating associations, to be mailed to board members before the next meeting.

Andy LaTomme was asked to prepare a press release announcing the formation of the Friends with special mention of Mike Bodkin's contribution.

Karen Wuethrich was asked to prepare minutes of the meeting.

The date for a second meeting was set for January 13, 1987. Shirley Bridgham was asked to arrange for a meeting room at SWOCC. The suggestion was made that the board consider a fixed meeting date, e.g., the second Tuesday of each month. It was felt that this was a good idea, but no action was taken.

The meeting adjourned at 10:00 pm.




ANNUAL MEETING





Every winter the gardens at Shore Acres State Park come to life under the glow of thousands of holiday lights.



This year, over 325,000 lights will be strung through the formal gardens and about 45,000 visitors will walk through the displays which include lighted sculptures, landscape lights, and 26 decorated Christmas trees.

The annual event began twenty-nine years ago, when members of the newly formed "Friends of Shore Acres" discussed keeping the gardens lit at night. Curious if people would drive down the winding Cape Arago Highway in the dark, they tried it out over the Christmas holiday. The Friends hung 6,000 landscaping lights and nine thousand people showed up. The Holiday



Lights at Shore Acres became an instant community tradition.

Shirley and David Bridgham were part of the original Friends of Shore Acres and today they co-chair the Holiday Lights. Every year David works on creating new sculptures, sometimes collaborating with local artists if his idea requires it. "We've slowly added sculptures over the years until we've amassed a large array," David said.

Today there are dozens of lighted sculptures located throughout the formal gardens, from a life-sized grey whale, to lady bugs and butterflies, to an undersea garden designed to look like the bottom of the ocean. New this year is an animated sea gull at the entrance of the garden that appears



to be flying. The sculptures, David explained, "relate to who we are and where we are."

While David creates the sculptures, Shirley designs the displays, "We try to balance out all the colors," Shirley said. When in bloom, the whole garden is balanced in color and that



design element continues with the holiday lights. "We use the same color of light that the bush blooms," she explained. A red rhododendron gets red clusters of lights, and the hydrangeas get clusters of blue.

During the Holiday Lights, the Garden House, built in the early 1900s, is decorated in an old time Christmas theme and is open for viewing. It is a highlight for many visitors including kids who love seeing Santa in the bath tub upstairs. "It is one of the traditions" David said. "One year we tried to go without the Santa and that lasted about two days," Shirley laughed.

Some nights David and Shirley stand at the entrance as people walk in to the garden. "When people come around the corner," Shirley said, "you hear a gasp. They can't believe this display is here, in Coos Bay. Even some of




our locals can't believe this is here."

The Holiday Lights at Shore Acres run every night from Thanksgiving through New Year's Eve, 4:00 pm to 9:30 pm. Shirley said that Monday and Tuesdays are the least crowded nights, and while the weekends are busy, there is always plenty of parking. If you are especially interested in seeing the Garden House during a less crowded time, she suggests coming out when they are having a misty rain.



Shore Acres State Park is located at 89039 Cape Arago Highway, Coos Bay (13 miles southwest of the cities of Coos Bay/North Bend). The entire event is free however there is a \$5 per vehicle parking fee for the State Park.



Looking Back at a Different Memorable Visit

Friends and Friends' Journal Travel to France and Share a Bit of History

It is filled with climber rose trees and has an alley of orange trees. There is a large cutting garden here, filled with flowers exclusively produced to grace the rooms of the Chateau.

Another interesting part of its history

is that during World War I, the Grand Gallery served as a military hospital where more than 2,200 soldiers were cared for. During World War II, the Cher River that flows under the Chateau's Gallery was the border between the French State that had sovereignty over southern France, and Nazicontrolled northern France. Chenonceau saw many prisoner swaps, and also some prisoner escapes.

hile I'm in a catch-up mode, I'm attaching a photo of the Chateau de Chenonceau in the Loire Valley of France where Mike and I visited in 2013 and 2014, one of the most magnificent of many wonderful chateaux in France.

The back story: Its construction began in 1513. King Henry II moved in at one point

and in 1547 he gave the Chateau to his mistress, Diane de Poitiers. She added an arched bridge across the Cher River to access hunting grounds. She took a small, rustic garden established by the previous owner and turned it into a lovely formal garden divided into four large triangles set in impressive fruit trees, with strawberry plants and violets bordering the paths. The "Le Jardin de Diane" fountain she installed still sits in the center of the garden. (Diane's garden is seen in the photo with Mike.) She enjoyed the Chateaus and her garden until the king died of injuries sustained in a jousting tournament in 1559.

Upon his death, Henry's vengeful wife, Catherine de Medicis, unceremoniously kicked Diane out and into a much drabber chateau called Chaumont. Catherine added a three-story structure on top of Diane's bridge and created her own garden (*The photo with me*).

Springtime Publicity – 2016



o matter how many times I travel along these 363 miles, the Oregon Coast continues to amaze me. Although it is always a different experience from day to day and season to season, it never fails to provide a "wow." One of my favorite stops on the South Oregon Coast is Cape Arago, a required side trip off Highway 101 for any traveler, in my opinion. It is a drive of less than a half hour from downtown Coos By or North Bend to reach a remarkable string of three State Parks along this spectacular cape. You start with a scenic view of Sunset Bay, a protected cove and beach with rocky reefs and islands guarding its mouth. As you continue, views of the Cape Arago Lighthouse emerge before you reach Shore Acres State Park and one of the most amazing viewpoints in Oregon. It's known for great wave action year round, but when storms whip up huge swells, there's no other place like it. The reefs and cliff sides turn incoming waves into explosions that resemble fireworks, then water cascades like a waterfall down richly textured rock formations. I'm always entranced by this constantly changing scene, making it difficult for me to leave as I convince myself to stay for "just one more wave." On this visit, the sun broke out a few minutes between showers and rainbow appeared and dissolved with each momentous crash. Nearby, simpson Reef is usually active with sea lions whose bellowing echoes throughout the areas. Finally, Cape Arago State Park denotes the end of the road with expansive views and access to colorful intertidal areas. Hike the length of this stunning cape in spring and you're likely to enjoy wildflower dotted trails and catch glimpses of seals nursing their newborns. Although Cape Arago is exceptional, it's not an exception. The momentous Oregon Coast has many surprises in store for your



hore Acres State Park hosted a Shakespeare in the Park event with actors from area theatres. This was the first of two Art in the Park events at Shore Acres and Sunset Bay. We applied for and were approved to receive grants from the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department Heritage Fund designed to bring artistic events to our State Parks.

Fifteen different local thespians from three different community theatre groups (Logos Players, The Dolphin Players, and Little Theatre on the Bay) took part in this free event, performing two monologues and four scenes from a variety of William Shakespeare's plays. These scenes were performed once each day, and took place in two different locations within Shore Acres Gardens.

The Friends of Shore Acres were instrumental in putting on this event, funding the rental of chairs for the audience, as well as the tent and stage for the Rose Garden location. Volunteers from the friends also had the Garden House open each day, with cookies and juice for the spectators, who attended in numbers over 80 every day.

The total amount of attendees for the event over the four days was approximately 280 people who got to experience the amazing works of William Shakespeare in the beautiful outdoor setting of Shore Acres Gardens.

All feedback has been excellent, and all the volunteer participants had wonderful things to say about the experience and want to take part again in the future. Look for our next Shakespeare in the Park event to be a full play, taking place in September of 2017. ■

"A Gathering of Finches" Author Jane Kirkpatrick Speaks at Shore Acres - June 26, 2016

INSPIRATION FOR THE BOOK:

Twenty years ago Coos Bay residents Ken and Nancy Tedder brought their relatives Jane and Jerry Kirkpatrick to Shore Acres State Park. What followed was the acclaimed book *A Gathering of Finches* (1997) by author Jane Kirkpatrick. That visit to the park led to her journey to discover the story of Cassie Hendricks Stearns Simpson for whom Louis Simpson designed this now jewel of a state park.

"I kept trying to find out what kind of a woman would inspire this beautiful place," said Kirkpatrick. "My husband loves me very much but he gives me earrings. Who was this woman and why didn't we know more about her?"

With some trepidation she called on descendant of Cassie Simpson, Mrs. Peg Day, who enthusiastically joined her quest helping her uncover lost documents.

"The book has touched people from around the world," Kirkpatrick says. "I hear from descendants of Louie's brother and sister and from people who read the book and said they'd changed their lives because of it." The book was adapted into a stage production performed by North Bend's Waterfront Players led by Judy McDonald in the early 2000s. Kirkpatrick dedicated the book to her sister, Judy Hurtley, who died later that year.

Thousands of visitors each year enjoy the gardens and Kirkpatrick notes that people make the trek with family members to see for themselves this lavish estate that marked a great though tragic love affair.

I received a lovely letter from a young mother that moved me in the way that I hope my novels move others: to consider the power of their own stories, their own home towns, their own families.

History and story enrich our lives and between history and story lies memory. This young woman, now a mother, made memories. I couldn't be happier.

LETTER FROM ATTENDEE

Hi Jane,

Thanks again for speaking at Shore Acres today, and for taking a picture with me! I can't emphasize enough how much your book (and others, but particularly 'A Gathering of Finches') influenced me and made me fall in love with the history of my hometown.

My parents owned a charter fishing business in Charleston, OR so I spent most of my childhood on boats and at the beach. Growing up in that environment you don't quite realize how unique and special the Oregon coast is. And like many people that grow up in Coos County, I visited Shore Acres every December for the spectacular light display. I just had no idea that Shore Acres had such a history!

When I was in high school I read your book for the first time and my curiosity was insatiable. It blew my mind that you were writing about people in my own town, and mentioning places I had been to dozens of times. (I can still vividly remember your description of the Simpsons trying to get to the Shore Acres location, and to this day I cannot fathom how they built roads and traveled.)

Because I had a job shelving books at the public library, I started researching the Simpson family, Shore Acres, and Coos County. I dragged my mom and sister all over, trying to find historical markers. We hiked all over Shore Acres. I was able to recall important events in the book and really connect to the history. It was a great summer, and even when I went to college and brought friends home to visit I became a little tour guide for the history of Shore Acres. :)

Thank you again for helping me appreciate the history of my home! It was a pleasure to meet you and hear you speak.
